UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. Complaint Case No.205/2022 was decided in favour of the petitioner, by the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission-VI (New Delhi)¹ by an order dated 25th November, 2024.
2. The relevant Bench of the DCDRC comprised of Ms. Poonam Chaudhry, President, and Mr. Bariq Ahmad and Mr. Shekhar Chandra as Members.
3. Respondent before the DCDRC applied for a review. Such petition was

allowed on 25th August 2025 by a Bench of which Ms. Poonam Chaudhry, President and Mr. Bariq Ahmad, Member constituted the coram.

4. Challenging the order dated 25th August 2025 allowing the review, the petitioner approached the High Court with a petition under Article 227 of the Constitution of India. The impugned order dated 17th April, 2026 has declined interference on the ground that Section 41 of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 permits an appeal against the order dated 25th August, 2025.

5. Before us, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner questions the non-inclusion of Mr. Shekhar Chandra, Member, who had authored the order dated 25th November, 2024. According to him, Mr. Shekhar Chandra was a Member of the DCDRC on 25th August, 2025; and, this is revealed from an order authored by him on 30th October 2025 while disposing of Case No.CC 505/2016.

6. Regulation 15 of the Consumer Protection (Consumer Commission Procedure) Regulations, 2020 provides as follows:-

“15. **Review.**-(1) It shall set out clearly the grounds for review.
(2) Unless otherwise ordered by the Consumer Commission, an application for review shall be disposed of by circulation without oral arguments, as far as practicable between the same members who had delivered the order sought to be reviewed.”

7. Without entering into the merits of the controversy raised by the petitioner in the special leave petition, we are desirous of ascertaining from the DCDRC the reason as to why Mr. Shekhar Chandra, Member, who had authored the order dated 25th November 2025, was not included in the Bench which decided the review petition of the respondent.

8. Let a report in this regard be called for from the Registry of the DCDRC for our consideration.

9. Relist the special leave petition in the week commencing 5th October, 2026.
10. The report, which must be filed by 3rd October, 2026, shall be placed on record by the Registry.
