This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts of the case are that the Applicant e-filed the Interlocutory Application (IA) on 27.04.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the IA on 28.04.2026, intimated the defects to the Applicant on the same day. The Applicant re-filed the IA on 05.08.2026. It is stated in the Interlocutory Application (IA) that while undertaking the process of re-filing, the counsel for the Applicant, inadvertently uploaded the earlier/incorrect electronic file instead of uploading the final corrected set of the interlocutory application. During the relevant period, the counsel for the Applicant was to travel to his hometown at Kapurthala, Punjab, in connection with his marriage and the ceremonies and family obligations connected therewith. Upon discovering the inadvertent uploading error, the counsel took steps to upload the correct file, remove the remaining objections and complete the re-filing process. Hence, there is delay of 99 days in re-filing the IA, so the same may be condoned.

Heard learned Counsel appearing for the Applicant and Perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Applicant was required to re-file the IA within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Applicant re-filed the IA with a delay of 92 days, hence, the case may be placed before the Hon'ble Bench for appropriate orders.
