[1] Mr. M. Hemchandra, learned Senior Advocate assisted by Mr. Thomas Laishram, learned counsel appeared on behalf of the petitioner and Mr. Shyam Sharma, learned GA appeared on behalf of the respondents.

[2] In view of the limited prayer made on behalf of the petitioner and as agreed to by both the counsel appearing for the parties, the present writ petition as well as the connected application are hereby disposed of at the Motion stage.

[3] At the outset, the learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that for redressing the grievances raised by the writ petitioner in the present writ petition, a representation dated 15-07-2024 was submitted to the respondents and that the said representation is still pending for consideration and disposal. The learned senior counsel submitted that the petitioner will be satisfied for the time being if the present writ petition is disposed of by issuing a simple direction to the Commissioner (Home), Government of Manipur (respondent No. 2), to consider the said representation on its own merit and strictly in terms of the applicable rules/ guidelines and to dispose of the same by issuing a speaking order within a stipulated period.

[4] Mr. Shyam Sharma, learned GA appearing for the respondents fairly submitted that as the prayer made on behalf of the petitioner is confined to the consideration and disposal of the representation submitted by them, he has no objection in disposing of this writ petition as prayed for by the learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioner.

[5] Considering the submission made by the learned counsel appearing for the parties and the limited prayer made on behalf of the petitioner, this court is of the considered view that it will serve the interests of justice to issue the following directions:-

- (i) The Commissioner/ Secretary (Home), Government of Manipur, is hereby directed to consider the aforesaid representation dated 15-07-2024 submitted by the petitioner on its own merit and strictly in terms of the applicable rules/guidelines and to dispose of the same by issuing a speaking order;
- (ii) The whole process for consideration and disposal of the said representation should be completed within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order;
- (iii) The respondent No. 2 is further directed to furnish to the petitioner a copy of the order passed in connection with the said representation within a period of two weeks from the date of issuance of such an order; and

- (iv) It is made clear that the above directions have been issued without touching upon the merit of the present writ petition and the respondent No. 2 is at liberty to pass any appropriate order strictly in accordance with law.

With the aforesaid directions, the present writ petition as well as the connected application are hereby disposed of.
