This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts giving rise to present IA (re-filing) are that the Appellant e-filed the Memo of Appeal on 13.03.2026. The Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 25.03.2026, intimated the defects to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Appeal on 30.06.2026. It is stated in the IA that there is a delay of 90 days in re-filing the captioned Appeal as the delay in re-filing the present Appeal has been due to the reasons which are beyond the control of the Appellant and the Applicant has acted diligently in removing the defects marked by the Registry and has been removing the defects with utmost urgency. The delay in re-filing was neither intentional nor deliberate, so the same may be condoned.

Heard Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the Appellant and perused the averments made in the IA as well as Office report.

The Appellant was required to re-file the Memo of Appeal within seven days from the date of intimation of the defects. However, the Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal with a delay of 90 days, hence, the case be placed before the Hon'ble Bench with defect for appropriate orders.
