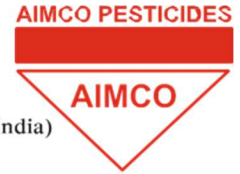

**Opinion**

The said financial statements has been audited by other auditors whose report has been furnished to us by the Management and our conclusion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of the said subsidiary, is based solely on the report of the other auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph “Auditors Responsibilities for the Audit of Consolidated Financial Statements”.
- b. In case of another subsidiary, whose financial statements (before eliminating inter- company transactions), reflect total asset of Rs. 0.98 lakhs, Net cash out flow of Rs.20.91 lakhs, total revenue Rs. Nil, net loss of Rs. 6.21 Lakhs and Rs. 38.33 Lakhs and total comprehensive Loss of Rs. 6.21 Lakhs and Rs. 38.33 Lakhs for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2026, as considered in the Statement, The financial statements of the said subsidiary is certified by management of the said subsidiary and our conclusion, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of the said subsidiary, is solely based on such financial statements certified by the management of the said subsidiary. According to the information and explanations given to us by the management, the financial statements of the said subsidiary are not material to the Group.

Our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries, is based solely on the report of the other auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph “ Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Results”.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the matters (a) and (b) above with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditors.
